Act 203 introduced a change to the timing of compulsoryreviews of Parliamentarypolling stations and polling place. The next compulsoryreview must now be started and completed between 1 October 203 and 31 anuary 205 (nclusive) In practice in Argly and Bute, the filing of polling distric boundaries and polling places is delegated to their featurive who also acts as the Retuning Officer A review has now been undertaken based on a range of data and several changes are proposed. These proposals now need to be the subject of public consultation.

The polling districts and polling places were lastered in Argli and Bute in 208 The polling district boundaries and polling places are the same for elections whether UK Parliamentary Scottish Parliamentary or local government elections.

2. Definition of terms

Polling district: the area created by the division of a constituency or ward into smaller parts, within or for which a polling place can be designated whic convenient to electors.

Polling place: the building or area in which polling asions are situated Polling places are normally within the polling disct unless it is not possible to find a suitable place within the area or it is more convenient for the majority of voters. Certain trees of buildings are not normally designated as polling places, f example, places of worship and licensed premise, and schools are only used where there is no reasonable alternative in order to avoid disruption to pupils education.

Polling station: the room or area within the polling place where voting tall place. The number of polling stations in a polling place depends on the number and distribution of electors in the polling district.
