POLICY ZONE C: AIRD NAN RÒN TO STRONDOIR BAY

LANDSCAPE CHARACTERISTICS

The landscape is predominately an upland plateau with rounded ridges and rocky outcrops. There is an extensive large-scale mosaic of open moorland and forestry plantations.

SEASCAPE CHARACTERISTICS


The south end of this policy zone has a comparatively wide boulder shore at low tide indicating a gently sloping intertidal and subtidal seabed. The coast is open with little indentation and is potentially quite exposed to southerly and south-easterly winds.

ACCESS


The main A83 trunk road runs parallel to the loch shore from Aird nan Ròn to Strondoir Bay. There is only one point of access to the loch, at the Sloc nam Fearna lay-by, where it is possible to launch small boats from trailers. This access to the loch lies adjacent to an old concrete jetty which is in a state of ruin.

VISUAL AMENITY


From the trunk road, which is very close to the loch shore, views are broad, open, distant, mostly uninterrupted and generally unremarkable over to the rolling hills of Cowal, which are dominated by forestry plantation. There are no paths adjacent to this area, but there are a few lay-bys along the road side with open views to the loch. At Clach an Easbuig, there is a view point with a roadside picnic table. Views at Sloc nam Fearna are dominated by the Meall Mhor salmon farm, which lies particularly close to shore.
